THE CROWN OF LIFE

I have been engaged in my own in-depth continual study of the Book of Revelation again for some time now. And, today, as I compose this month's pastoral note to you, I am reflecting on the letters to the seven churches in Asia.

There are many things happening in various churches around the world and in our own denomination that bring about concerns—that so many churches are becoming worldly. I ask that you hold the UMC in your prayers as Annual Conferences are held around the globe this summer. This is an election year and Karol Rader, Warren Carey, Emily Christman, & I will be attending our West Ohio Annual Conference June 6-10 as we vote on lay & clergy delegates for the 2012 General Conference of the UMC. Warren will be casting our lay member vote this year and Emily will have her first experience as a youth representative. Every General Conference addresses a variety of important issues, adopts changes to our *Book of Discipline*, which includes our doctrinal standards, our social principles, and other polity matters, such as the position and missional statements of our denomination worldwide. **WE MUST BE IN PRAYER FOR THE UMC AS WE PRESS ON IN THESE DISCUSSIONS AND DELIBERATIONS.** I cannot emphasize that enough. **PRAY** as we head into these elections both in our annual conference and in preparation for 2012.

I do not want us to become, **as a local church or a denomination**, the Church of Pergamum (Rev. 2:12-17), the church in an evil environment that TOLERATED wrong doctrine and the teaching from heretics. Nor, do I want us to become like the Church of Laodicea (Rev. 3:14-22) that was spiritually lukewarm and blind to needs. And, I do not want to see us die away as the Church of Sardis (Rev. 3:1-6), heading toward spiritual death due to apathy and inactivity. This leads me to some concerns of our own congregation...

We are entering more fully into a time of dramatic and exciting change as we patiently (or not so patiently) wait for good weather to continue forward with our building project. In June, we will be removing the contents of the cornerstone of our current building and transferring them, along with additional items, to the cornerstone of the new building as we lay the foundation. While no specific date can be confirmed at this time, we are in hopes that we can incorporate it into our celebration and the progressive dinner planned for June 25th. Please "stay tuned" for more information and details in the coming weeks.

We have many things to celebrate. Not only are we celebrating the building project (after 24 years), but our "Rainbow Bridges" After-School program was a great success. I want to thank Nancy Knight and all those who volunteered with this monthly outreach to the community. Kudos! Well-done, good & faithful servants!

As we celebrate this time and our achievements so far, let us not become apathetic or inactive during the summer. This is a time when we need to continue with our mission to the community and to continue working on fundraisers to pay for this new facility, which we believe will truly benefit the DeGraff and surrounding community as a whole. We are committed to fulfilling the God-given vision through every avenue before us.

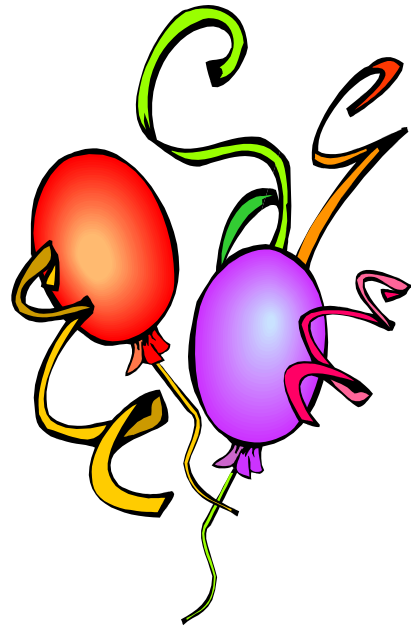
Report of the April Finance Meeting


